

June 2017 Executive Summary


The Yolo County Local Child Care Planning Council aims to address the child care needs of all families in Yolo County. As part of this process, the Council completes a comprehensive needs assessment at least every five years to understand the current child care needs in Yolo County, document the ways that these needs have changed over time, and respond to the specific child care needs in the county. This year's needs assessment collected data from several sources, including the California Department of Education, Yolo County Child Welfare Department, U.S. Census American Community Survey, Community Care Licensing, Yolo County Office of Education, Yolo County Children's Alliance, and Children's Home Society of California.

What is the unmet need for child care in Yolo County?

An additional 13,761 full-time child care slots are needed to meet child care needs in Yolo County.



^{*}These slots are from licensed child care centers (5,296), licensed family child care homes (2,476), and license-exempt centers (12).


Over 5,500 of these slots must be subsidized to meet full-time child care needs among families at or below 70% of the state median income.






What is Yolo County's child care capacity?

For the 21,545 children with working parents in Yolo County, there are 7,784 full-time licensed slots available.




Nearly 8,000 children ages 0-12 are eligible for subsidized child care. There are 2,293 subsidized slots available.*



^{*}The number of subsidized slots available includes both <u>slots</u> (e.g., Head Start) and <u>number of children</u> (e.g., CalWORKs).

Where are full-time child care slots available in Yolo County?

The majority of licensed child care slots for 0-2 year olds are in licensed family child care homes. For children ages 3-12, the majority of slots are in licensed child care centers.*
